

As part of our Lenten programme, each of the six churches part of CTA&F organised prayer spaces on six Saturdays in Lent, based on themes from people Jesus encountered 'on the way' to the cross. Next Saturday **8 April**, it will be at St Andrew's from 10.00 am till midday.

OUR LENTEN CONVERSATION - 'OUR PARTICIPATION IN THE MASS' ABOUT SESSION 4 - COMMUNION AND MISSION

Each week we are extending the Lenten conversation 'Our Participation in the Mass' to everyone in the parish through this short summary of the session, with questions to ponder in the week ahead in order that everyone can grow in their appreciation of the jewel of the church – the Mass. Why not join us on Tuesday!



As the prayer of thanksgiving comes to a close, our posture makes a dramatic change. We stand, often stretching and flexing, entering into the time when we become forged together into a physical body that reflects the spiritual union of which we were active witnesses in the Eucharistic Prayer.

This physicality is made real through words once more, in the prayer that Jesus gave us – the Lord's Prayer. The Our Father expresses adoration, faith and a request for God's graces to always flow over and through us. This prayer reflects the need we have for God's mercy and the commandment to love one another. This sense of unity is then made tangible through the sharing of the peace with each other. This is an intense moment that prepares us for our deeper sharing of Jesus.

When we are old enough, we join in the formal procession that leads us to the foot of the altar – which is the foot of the Cross of Jesus – in order to become one with Jesus. This is the meaning of communion. We do not take something, we give ourselves in order to be united into Jesus.

This unity means that we all have been empowered, including those who are present but did not receive communion. The power we receive is the power to act, to fulfil the mission that Jesus gave us in the story of the last supper in John's Gospel. In this picture we see Jesus as the servant, and that is the call we are given, and the instruction we are given at the end of the Mass, as the deacon tells us to go out into the world.

Here are some questions to ponder this week.

- What does the 'breaking of the bread' reveal about Jesus Christ?
- In what ways do we express unity with Jesus Christ and with each other in the communion?
- How do I feel about the personal gift of Jesus and his power in my life?
- What enables me to feel ready to act in the world around me as a result of participating in Mass?

What Happens in Holy Week

Maundy Thursday

The liturgy of Holy Thursday is not merely a prelude to the events of Jesus' Passion and death. It celebrates the heart of the mystery that is revealed in all of our sacraments and in our service to others.



This Mass includes the celebration of the institution of the Eucharist and of the service of our priests. It reveals Jesus as the servant in the example of the washing of the feet. It is this service that shows us what being a disciple is all about.

Watching And Waiting

At the close of the Maundy Mass the altar is stripped and the Blessed Sacrament removed from the tabernacle to signify Jesus' arrest and isolation. For a few hours we gather to watch and wait as the disciples did in the garden.

Good Friday

This day we celebrate Jesus' Passion, the death he suffered on the Cross for our sake. It is 'Good' Friday precisely because of the victory over death which Jesus won by emptying himself. It is a



ceremonial that represents and reflects on 'love' as much as it does on 'loss'. This moving and thought-provoking service shows us the cost of discipleship – how we too must empty ourselves to be truly followers of Christ.

Easter Vigil

The ceremony on Holy Saturday is much more than a Mass – it is **the Eucharist!** For in this evening service the whole depth of the victory won by Christ in being raised from the dead is starkly represented by the darkened church being pierced by the light of a single Paschal candle. This is the light of Christ breaking into our lives anew. It is spectacular! It reminds us that this event is what we celebrate at every Mass, every Sunday and on every weekday.

The profound and meaning-filled liturgy is a living reminder that for all of us our baptism reflects the action of being reborn into the new life of Resurrection – to be adopted by this action as sons and daughters of God, redeemed through Christ's sacrifice and RISING!

Easter Sunday continues the story of the Resurrection and marks the start of the whole week of Easter, when every day for eight days it remains the one, single day of Easter...a time when we are reminded about the gravity of the Resurrection in our lives.
