# Birthday of the Blessed Virgin Mary - 8 September

If you are quick with maths, you've probably already worked out that 8 September is exactly nine months after 8 December, the feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary.

Christians normally celebrate the day on which saints die, because that is when they entered into eternal life. And indeed, Catholics celebrate the end of Mary's life in the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. But we also celebrate three birthdays and Mary's is one of them. The other two are the births of Christ and St John the Baptist, and the common thread tying these feasts together is that all three, Mary, Jesus, and St John, were born without original sin.



In earlier centuries, the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary was celebrated with greater fanfare; today, however, most Catholics probably do not even realise that the Church has a special feast day set aside to celebrate it. But, like the Immaculate Conception, the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary is an important date in our salvation history. Christ needed a mother, and Mary's conception and birth, therefore, are events without which Christ's own birth would have been impossible.

It's no surprise, then, that the Christians of the second century AD recorded the details of Mary's birth in such documents as the Protoevangelium of James, and the Gospel of the Nativity of Mary. While neither document bears the authority of scripture, they provide us with everything that we know about the life of Mary before the Annunciation, including the names of Mary's parents, St Joachim and St Anna. It is a good example of tradition, which complements (while never contradicting) scripture.

# Questions about the Future of the Parish

We are repeating the following question as it is important. With only one Mass on a Sunday in the future, where will I park?

You are right to be concerned about the capacity of our parking space. We cannot use the space around the church to expand our parking capacity – due to planning and traffic restrictions. HOWEVER, with some creative thinking and the cooperation of Flitwick Lower School we will be providing additional car parking, five minutes walk from the church. To ensure that parking is best used we make the onsite parking for visitors and permit holders only. These permits will give priority to the disabled, frail, elderly and those with other needs. Apart from visitors, ALL of the remainder of the parish community will be encouraged to use the school car park or elsewhere, walk to church and find other ways to limit their need to park near the church. 
