The Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is often called 'The door of the Church', because it is the first of the seven sacraments and the reception of the other sacraments depends on it. It is the first of the three Sacraments of Initiation, the other two being the Sacrament of Confirmation and the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Once baptised, a person becomes a member of the Church.



Christ himself ordered his disciples to preach the Gospel to all nations and to baptise those who accept the message of the Gospel. For Catholics, the sacrament is not a mere formality; it is the very mark of a Christian, because it brings us into new life in Christ. And because it is so important, it is necessary for parents to understand what they are asking for their child therefore we have regular courses run by Catherine Davies.

Baptism has six primary effects, which are all supernatural graces:

- 1. The removal of the guilt of both Original Sin and personal sin.
- 2. The remission of all punishment that we owe because of sin, both temporal and eternal.
- 3. The infusion of grace in the form of sanctifying grace.
- 4. Becoming a part of Christ.
- 5. Becoming a part of the Church, which is the Mystical Body of Christ on earth.
- 6. Enabling participation in the sacraments, the priesthood of all believers, and the growth in grace.

The core of the baptism rite is: the pouring of water over the head of the person to be baptised and saying the words 'I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit'. This is concluded with the anointing with the Holy Chrism.

8 September – Birthday of the Blessed Virgin Mary

If you are quick with math, you've probably already figured out that 8 September is exactly nine months after 8 December, the feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary.

Christians normally celebrate the day on which saints died, because that is when they entered into eternal life. And indeed, Catholics celebrate the end of Mary's life in the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. But we also celebrate three birthdays and Mary's is one of them. The other two are the births of Christ and St John the Baptist, and the common thread tying these feasts together is that all three, Mary, Jesus, and St John, were born without Original Sin.



In earlier centuries, the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary was celebrated with greater fanfare; today, however, most Catholics probably do not even realise that the Church has a special feast day set aside to celebrate it. But, like the Immaculate Conception, the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary is an important date in our salvation history. Christ needed a mother, and Mary's conception and birth, therefore, are events without which Christ's own birth would have been impossible.

It's no surprise, then, that the Christians of the second century AD recorded the details of Mary's birth in such documents as the Protoevangelium of James and the Gospel of the Nativity of Mary. While neither document bears the authority of Scripture, they provide us with everything that we know about the life of Mary before the Annunciation, including the names of Mary's parents, St Joachim and St Anna. It is a good example of tradition, which complements (while never contradicting) scripture.


CANON BENNIE'S HOLIDAY
