## 11 February – Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes

Located in the Pyrenees Mountains region of France, Lourdes is the home of one of the most important shrines in the Catholic faith: the Grotto of Massabielle.

Approximately five million pilgrims, of whom a great number are sick or handicapped, come to Lourdes each year. It may be through curiosity, through a desire for a physical cure, in a movement towards belief, or to be of service to those who suffer, that they come to drink the water from the holy spring.

This region of France was a strategic stronghold during medieval times. Situated at the foot of the Pyrenees, the medieval castle of Lourdes provided protection against foreign forces. During the Hundred Years War, the French captured this region from the English in 1406 after an eighteen-month siege. The medieval castle was used as a state prison from the reign of Louis XIV (1643-1715) until the beginning of the 19<sup>th</sup> century. It was in 1858 when Lourdes' importance as a military and state stronghold ended and its spiritual importance began.



Between 11 February and 26 July 1858, Bernadette Soubirous, a 14-year-old peasant girl, experienced eighteen apparitions of the Virgin Mary in the nearby Massabielle grotto. During the ninth vision, an underground spring with healing powers was revealed. The Holy See recognises sixty-seven miracles attributable to the water that flows from it.

During the eighteen apparitions the Virgin Mary spoke to Bernadette suggesting that we come to Lourdes. The response of millions of us to that invitation is made in Lourdes each year, a world centre of pilgrimage and a special place of meeting between God and people.

## 10 February – Feast of St Scholastica (480-543)

St Scholastica was the twin sister of St Benedict, the founder of the Benedictine Order. Benedict and Scholastica were born of wealthy parents in fifth-century Italy. They were raised together until Benedict left for Rome to continue his studies.

Scholastica was dedicated to God at an early age, though for a time she probably continued to stay with her parents. Some years later, she left home and founded a religious order for women near Monte Cassino in central Italy, where Benedict had established his famous monastery. The twins used to visit each other once a year. Since Scholastica, as a woman, was not allowed inside the monastery, their meetings occurred in a nearby farmhouse where Benedict and his sister spent hours discussing spiritual matters. In the last of these meetings, Scholastica implored her brother to stay the entire night with her, so that they could continue talking until morning about the joys of heaven.



Benedict refused, since that would mean he and the monks accompanying him would have to break his rule about not spending a night outside the monastery. Scholastica thereupon prayed, asking God that her brother might remain. In response to her prayer, a severe thunderstorm suddenly broke out, preventing the monks from leaving. Benedict cried out, 'God forgive you, sister! What have you done?' Scholastica answered, 'I asked a favour of you and you refused. I asked it of God and he granted it.' Benedict and Scholastica thus spent the night discussing the nature of heaven, a fitting subject, for Scholastica was soon to experience its joys. Three days after this conversation, Benedict was at prayer in his monastery when he saw the soul of his sister ascending to heaven in the form of a dove. Benedict then announced her death to his monks, and later buried her in the tomb he had prepared for himself.

## Children's Prayer Bag Scheme

The 'prayer bag' scheme for the youngest children of our parish has started. This scheme is to help parents give their children an experience of the Bible and prayer in the comfort of their own home.



We are all used to spending time with our children in following up with reading and arithmetic tasks from school. These times provide not only of learning but also a time for conversation with our children, a precious thing in our ever-busy lives.

That too is the aim of our own prayer bags. Each bag features a different Bible character or story; each has a set of wooden figures that can be used to help explore the story. No deep knowledge of the Bible or church teaching is needed; everything is provided for parent and child story-time that will develop your children's understanding of the foundational stories of their faith. Arranged in the chronological order of the Old and New Testament the bags may be used in any sequence.

The parish has invested in the bags to teach people of all ages more about the faith. It is intended to enable parents to fulfil their baptism commitment, to be the 'first and best teachers of the child' in the ways of the faith. The prayer bags are ideally suited for children up to and including Year 1, after which we start our formal sacramental preparation.

If you have young children, please take a bag, and over two weeks explore the story and its activities. We simply ask that you return the bag after two weeks for the benefit of other families.
