A Reflection by Fr. Denis

Easter is a time when all nature is blooming, when the death of winter has passed, and when everything comes alive again. It would be really sad, indeed, if my inner spirit did not experience some of that reawakening. There is a movie called *Awakenings*, which depicts people with mental disabilities displaying glimpses of very intelligent life inside, and the ability, willingness, or otherwise, of those around to respond to that. Each of us, because of our baptism, has the potential for divinity within us, in so far as we are invited to share in the life of the Trinity. Responsibility is about responding to something, and each of us must take personal responsibility for the gift of Easter, and what it offers and holds for us. You can walk out of the door today, and today can be just another yesterday, or you can reflect seriously on all that you have heard, and, somewhere within your soul or your spirit, you can say yes. We will celebrate the results of that, yes a few weeks, from now when we celebrate the feast of Pentecost. The stone was rolled away from the tomb for Jesus on Easter morning, and the doors of the Upper Room were flung open for the apostles at Pentecost.

Fr. Denis writes ...

Eva Schloss knew her future stepsister, Anne Frank, before the teenage girl died in Auschwitz concentration camp. As children, the two girls played together. After the war, Eva's mother married Anne's widowed father, Otto Frank. Both families had lost treasured family members in the Holocaust, like so many other Jewish families in that dark period of human history.



During a radio interview years later, Eva, a former concert pianist, explained how, on Saturday nights before their arrests, the whole family would lie on the floor, in the



dark, listening to the exquisite music of Schubert's 'Trout' Quintet as their preparation for sleep. In decades to come, this music, and the memory of those unforgettable evenings, would still bring her joy.

Despite having lost so much, she explained that what she would pass on to the world was the message enshrined in Louis Armstrong's song 'What a Wonderful World'. Instead of learning bitterness, Eva had learned to appreciate life and its immeasurable capacity for all that is good. In seeing the horrors of the death camps, she saw life and learned to value things that perhaps would remain unnoticed by those who had not faced the ultimate in human brutality. She finished her radio interview by repeating the saying, 'it's a wonderful world!'

5 April – Feast of St Vincent Ferrer (1350-1419)

He was born in Valencia and joined the Dominicans at the age of 17. In 1399, with the approval of the Pope, he set out on his mission as a preacher. For twenty years he travelled through western Europe, with thousands flocking to hear him wherever he was. From 1408 he worked mostly south of the Pyrenees. Among others, he preached to the Jews, of whom some 25,000 were converted to Christianity, and in the Kingdom of Granada he converted thousands of Moors. In 1417 he moved on to Brittany and continued his work there; he died in Vannes in Brittany on 5 April 1419.
