

A Reflection by Fr. Denis

A very rich man died and arrived in heaven. He looked around at the beautiful buildings, and he already had his eye on a building that would become someone of his stature.



However, Peter beckoned him to follow, so he went along. The choice of beautiful buildings was breath-taking, but he was led past the whole lot. Finally, they came to an area where there was a little hovel, with just the bare essentials, and no creature comforts of any kind. When the man discovered that this was for him, he was furious, and demanded to know why he was given a hovel, when all the others had mansions. 'Well, you cannot blame me,' says Peter. 'You see, all we do is build with whatever material you send on ahead when you lived on earth. With what you sent this is the best we can do!'

Fr. Denis writes ...

Geoffrey Chaucer, often called the Father of English Literature, lived in fourteenth-century



London. His most famous work is *The Canterbury Tales*, a series of stories told by a group of pilgrims on their way to the tomb of St Thomas Becket in Canterbury Cathedral.

In the Prologue, Chaucer describes the different characters whose stories we will hear. One of these is the Prioress. She aspires to gentility and is not quite as unworldly as one might expect. For example, she wears a golden brooch on which can be seen the Latin words *Amor vincit omnia*, 'Love conquers all'. It is a worthy sentiment, until one remembers the various connotations of *amor*.

St Paul uses a different word in his proclamation of the nature of love: not the Greek equivalent of *amor* but a little-used Greek word, *agape*. The apostle proclaims the primacy of this love to a community too concerned with lesser gifts; too engaged in a rivalry of one person's spiritual gifts against another's; too status-conscious to be truly united. How do we define the love proclaimed by Paul? Perhaps 'Christ-like love' will suffice.



Paul has given us the supreme examination of conscious, to be pondered upon time and time again. It challenges us. It also inspires us. Let us be thankful for the evidence of Christ-like love in so many people around us. The all-embracing vocation of every Christian and every Christian community is quite simply to love as Christ loves. Such love is indeed unconquerable.

Sunday Latin Mass: Fr. Denis celebrates the Latin Mass at 5.00 pm on Sundays. The Mass is from the missal of 1962 and fulfils the Sunday obligation.


