Pope Francis published his letter on the meaning of the gospels for us in the world today in late 2013. Our Advent study programme will help us to reflect on his words and ponder how to bring his love and joy of the Word of God alive in our lives and the life of the parish.

Join us for the four Tuesday evening reflections!

We plan to explore the document by focusing on the main 'chapters'. We aim to cover :-

18 November – The Introduction and Missionary Transformation


25 November – Communal Commitment

2 December – Social Dimension'

9 December – Evangelisation and Spirit-Filled Evangelisers

There will be a short presentation on each evening followed by a time of reflection and conversation to consider the implications of this momentous document in the life of the Church today.

Sessions will begin at 7.45 pm (Tea and coffee from 7.30 pm) and finish by 9.45 pm in the parish room at the church.



Fr. Denis writes ...

Nowadays, the search for ancestors is big business. The Internet is full of websites offering help. More registers of births, marriages and deaths can now be accessed online. Some sites offer the oldest ancestry of all. All we have to do is send some mouth swabs and our DNA is then analysed. In a short time



we are given our genetic atlas. We find genetic 'cousins' in the most unexpected parts of the world. All this answers a deep human need: 'Where do I come from?'

That need was just as evident in ancient Israel as in our time. Of course there was none of the technology that we have today. But there were numerous records of ancestry written on scrolls and kept in safe places, including the Temple in Jerusalem. In Matthew's Gospel (1-17) we are given the genealogy of Christ. It is certainly not an easy passage to read; but it does have a hidden message. It can be divided into six groups of seven names. Seven is the most powerful of the symbolic numbers of the Bible. Christ is born at the beginning of the seventh seven of the sequence. His birth, Matthew is telling us, is what Israel has been looking forward to since the time of Abraham.



Jesus is the culmination of an ancestry that is as mixed as any. The divine incarnation takes on the authenticity of a human lineage. Perhaps this Gospel invites us to think a little more deeply about God's chosen people. It is God's eternal desire that they come to know Jesus as the true Messiah.

Could that not be one of our Advent prayers?



9 November – Feast of Dedication of the Lateran Basilica (c.324)

The Lateran Basilica was built on the Lateran Hill in Rome by the Emperor Constantine in about 324. The feast of its dedication has been celebrated in Rome on this date since the twelfth century. In honour of the basilica, 'the mother and head of all the churches of the city and the world', the feast has been extended to the whole Roman Rite as a sign of unity and love towards the See of Peter, which, as St Ignatius of Antioch said in the second century, 'presides over the whole assembly of charity.' It replaces the 32nd Sunday of ordinary time when it falls on a Sunday.

RECHECKING DBS/CRB CLEARANCES

We have a lot of people who assist the parish in so many ways and many of them require a check to ensure that all children and any adult in a vulnerable situation are never at risk. These checks need to be updated regularly, and following a period of procedural change it is now possible to resume our programme of rechecks.

So calling all those people whose CRB checks date from 2009, 2010 and 2011 – your time has come. I have a complete list of all the people who need to be checked so if you have forgotten the date of your last check or (perish the thought) have mislaid your certificate, just give me a ring on 01525 406 810.

For a recheck, you will need to complete three forms, the new DBS application form (DBS is the new CRB), a self-declaration form and a form to support your proof of identity. I will also need to see and photocopy three pieces of evidence to confirm your identity, e.g. passport, driving licence, birth certificate. A much longer list can be made available.

I will be available after the 6.00pm, 9.00am and 11.00 am Masses **this weekend 8 and 9 November** to help with this process and complete the forms with you.

If you have any questions to ask, please get in touch. If you are no longer carrying out the work for which you were cleared and do not need to be rechecked, I would very much appreciate a call so I don't have to chase you. If you won't be at Mass that weekend, again get in touch, please. There are 24 people who come into the category of requiring rechecks on this occasion so letting me know about things is vital.

Finally, I will have the forms ready very soon so if you want to make a start before the set weekend, get in touch – I know who you are.
