



## *Fr. Denis Writes...*



The faith that Nicodemus has professed is only a half-faith! It sees the miracle and misses the Messiah. It paddles in the shallow and needs to strike out into the deep. Or to use the metaphor in today's gospel, it needs to come out of the darkness and move towards the light! Nicodemus has come to Our Lord in more than one kind of darkness; not just the darkness of the night, but a darkness of perception too, the darkness of unbelief. He has come a certain distance for this meeting with Jesus. He has a long way to go yet before he encounters the dawn.


Whether Nicodemus, after listening to Our Lord, had got any further in faith, it is difficult to say. The indications are that he had not. The big obstacle for him was the notion of being 'born again', since he understood it only in the physical sense – how on earth could a man enter a second time into his mother's womb? (Jn 3:4). He had come in the dark. It looks as if he went home in the dark as well.


## A Reflection by Fr. Denis

Tuesday 17 March – St Patrick's Day

Patrick was born about the year AD 400, either near what is now called the English/Scottish border (in what was then the Province of Britannia in the Roman Empire), or near the River Severn by the present English/Welsh border. Wherever he was born, he was captured by raiders, made a slave and taken to Ireland when he was about sixteen years old. There he was forced to work in the fields, looking after sheep and pigs. He managed to escape in a ship which took him to France. Some time later he became a priest and then a bishop. He returned to his birthplace and had a vivid dream or a vision, calling him to return to Ireland and take the gospel to the people there.



It was as a young man as a captive that he had much time to think and reflect, and he grew in his relationship with God. Spending many days and nights in the open countryside, looking after the animals, he became more and more aware that God was there with him. Patrick learned to live in the Presence of God.
