THE JOY OF THE GOSPEL!

Pope Francis published his letter on the meaning of the gospels for us in the world today, in late 2013. Our Advent study programme will help us to reflect on his words and ponder how to bring his love and joy of the Word of God alive in our lives, and the life of the parish.

Join us for the four Tuesday evening reflections!

We plan to explore the document by focusing on the main 'chapters'. We aim to cover :-

18 November – The Introduction and Missionary Transformation


25 November – Communal Commitment

2 December – Social Dimension

9 December – Evangelisation and Spirit-Filled Evangelisers

There will be a short presentation on each evening followed by a time of reflection and conversation to consider the implications of this momentous document in the life of the Church today.

Sessions will begin at 7.45 pm (tea and coffee from 7.30 pm) and finish by 9.45 pm in the parish room at the church.



Fr. Denis writes ...

The 1968 film, *Planet of the Apes* has a shocking finale. As its hero, Taylor, played by Charlton Heston, rides along the shoreline, he sees something ahead of him. He dismounts and falls on his knees, shouting in shock and anger. Then the camera reveals what is in front of him. Charred and half-buried in the sand, its torch still held aloft, is the Statue of Liberty. Taylor at last realises that this mysterious planet is his home planet, the Earth. If anything conveys the destruction of a civilisation, it is that scene.



Nebuchadnezzar's dream is also shocking. It had shaken the king profoundly, and only Daniel can give an interpretation. The statue of different metals and feet of clay symbolises the sequence of powers in the



ancient Middle East. The last of these is the empire of the Greek king, Antiochus Epiphanes, the cruel persecutor of the Jewish people. Despite appearances, this empire is the weakest of them all and will be destroyed. Again we have a message of

hope and encouragement for the Jewish people of the second century before Christ. Pagan domination will end, and the Lord will give His people a kingdom that will endure forever.

We find it difficult to imagine an end to the societies that we live in, as did people in the past. But all earthly power is transient, so why should it be different for us? Whatever the future holds for humankind, there is a kingdom that will endure until the end of time. We have Christ's promise on that; and we have His invitation to seek that kingdom above all else.

Gift Aid envelopes will be available at the back of the church so that if you wish, you can make your donation go further.


