## 22 February – Feast of the Chair of St Peter

This feast celebrates St Peter, the rock upon whom Jesus built the Church. 'You are Peter,' Jesus said, 'and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it' (Mt 16:18).

The early Church in Rome was in the custom of marking the date that Peter arrived to publicly lead their community. Each year on this date, they dedicated the empty chair Peter sat on when he presided over the community in prayer. He used to sit in the chair to receive newly converted Christians who had been baptised. Still dripping wet, they would come to him in this chair to be anointed and confirmed.

Twenty-second February was chosen to coincide with what was understood as the anniversary of the day on which Jesus entrusted the Church to Peter with the words from Matthew's Gospel, above. The actual chair of this feast was lost long ago in one of the several invasions and plundering of Rome.

On this feast of the Chair of St Peter, let us pray for the Pope and for the Church!



## Our Bishop's Chair

*Cathedra* is the Latin word for a chair with armrests, and it appears in early Christian literature in the phrase *cathedrae apostolorum*, indicating authority derived directly from the apostles. A church into which a bishop's official *cathedra* is installed is called a cathedral. Bishop Peter's chair has the diocesan coat of arms at the top, and the apostles with the symbol of the Holy Spirit above their heads.

**OUR PARTICIPATION IN THE MASS**  
**Lenten Conversations for 2017**  
**Tuesdays, 7 March to 4 April: 7.45 pm to 9.30 pm**

Week by week we attend Mass; sometimes we feel fully engaged, at other times we can be distracted and preoccupied. Mass is called 'the source and summit' of our faith and life. This year our Lenten conversations explore how we can enhance our understanding and participation in the Mass and the community.

Each week we will extend the conversation to everyone in the parish by including a short summary of the session along with questions to ponder in the weekly newsletter. Thus everyone can grow in their appreciation of the jewel of the Church – the Mass.
