

A Reflection by Fr. Denis

In the gospel we are told that Jesus' enemies want to trap Him. The Pharisees and the

Herodians test Him with a trick question: 'Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not?' If Jesus forbids paying taxes to Rome, then He will be charged with sedition; but if He supports such pagan taxation, He will antagonise the people who want to be free of the Roman yoke. Notice that Jesus is not being asked to give some detailed analysis of church—state relations. So how does He react? He asks them for a coin with which the tax is paid. They give Him a denarius,



which has the image of Caesar on it. Jesus Himself has no such coin, but they do and we presume they would have used it to pay tax. So Jesus silences them by telling them to give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar. And then He states the more important principle: give back to God what belongs to God – which is everything. Jesus recognises there are some areas the state can deal with but only as long as they do not contradict God's law.

Fr. Denis writes ...

The attraction of capital cities has never been higher, especially in the developing world. Year by year their populations increase as ambitious young people seek the satisfaction, wealth and prosperity that elude them in remote rural settings. But often they are disappointed, failing to find employment, or falling in to hardship.

Jerusalem was the major city of the Holy

Land in the time of Jesus. It had been founded by King David; and the Temple, where God's dwelling was believed to be, dominated it. Luke



began and ended the story of his gospel in Jerusalem, and a major part of his gospel is centred on Jesus' journey to the city.

Tradition spoke of Wisdom making her home there. It was the scene of much prophetic activity. But Jesus was under no illusions of what He would find on His arrival. He knew that the city had rejected the prophets who had been sent to it. And this was tragic; He pictured Himself as a mother bird with her chicks. But this bird would perish and the city would be left desolated when in AD 70 Roman armies destroyed it, as Jesus warned the daughters of Jerusalem as He carried His

cross to Calvary.



The lament of Jesus over Jerusalem demonstrates His awareness of, and

sympathy with, human failure and sadness. But this did not dampen His determination to continue His mission: 'today, tomorrow and the next day I must go on.' He offers an example of perseverance and commitment, for us not only to admire but also to imitate.

We pray for protection for the most vulnerable: for those who struggle with eating disorders, who become addicted to drugs, alcohol and immorality, may they come to know You as their Lord and Saviour.

RECHECKING DBS/CRB CLEARANCES

We have a lot of people who assist the parish in so many ways and many of them require a check to ensure that all children and any adult in a vulnerable situation are never at risk. These checks need to be updated regularly, and following a period of procedural change it is now possible to resume our programme of rechecks.

So calling all those people whose CRB checks date from 2009, 2010 and 2011 – your time has come. I have a complete list of all the people who need to be checked so if you have forgotten the date of your last check or (perish the thought) have mislaid your certificate, just give me a ring on 01525 406 810.

For a recheck, you will need to complete three forms, the new DBS application form (DBS is the new CRB), a self-declaration form and a form to support your proof of identity. I will also need to see and photocopy three pieces of evidence to confirm your identity, e.g. passport, driving licence, birth certificate. A much longer list can be made available.

I will be available after the 6.00pm, 9.00am and 11.00 am Masses on the weekend of 8 and 9 November to help with this process and complete the forms with you.

If you have any questions to ask, please get in touch. If you are no longer carrying out the work for which you were cleared and do not need to be rechecked, I would very much appreciate a call so I don't have to chase you. If you won't be at Mass that weekend, again get in touch, please. There are 24 people who come into the category of requiring rechecks on this occasion so letting me know about things is vital.

Finally, I will have the forms ready very soon so if you want to make a start before the set weekend, get in touch – I know who you are.
