Report on AGM of Parish Management Group/ Parish Pastoral Council

The Parish Management Group annual general meeting was held on 12 March. It was encouraging to have parishioners attend and participate actively in the discussions. Hugh Davis from the Finance Group and Anne Gadsden our representative to the Pastoral Area attended.

Deacon Philip thanked Chris McMellon for his contribution to the PMG and Siobhan McGrath was welcomed as the new chair and Tim Basterfield as a new member of the team. John Flanagan agreed to remain on the PMG as the SVP representative. The other members of the PMG are Fr. Denis, Martin Brennan, Helen Burgess, Eamonn Diver, Maggie Dullaghan, Nicky Paterson, Deacon Philip and Suzanne Yates.

To reflect the pastoral focus of the group (Formation, Community and Resources) it was agreed to change the name of the PMG to Parish Pastoral Council.

Discussion followed and covered; the annual report which was printed and shared at all Masses on the previous weekend, *Feedback on the Future*; and the financial challenges.

Fr. Denis writes ...

Not surprisingly, nine months before Christmas the Church wants us, to celebrate on 25 March the conception of the child Jesus in the womb of His mother, Mary. The Church wants to remind us that the angel, the messenger, is bringing us



good news, the ultimate Good News. Indeed when the child is born, St Luke has another angel appearing to the shepherds and spelling it out: 'I bring you news

of great joy, a joy to be shared by the whole people.' But, if anything, the news as we hear it in the Annunciation story is tinged more with fear and anxiety than joy and happiness. The situation is not right. Mary and Joseph have not yet sealed their relationship so the news does not make sense. God's messenger has to give reassurance and open Mary's mind and heart to the miracle that will transform not only her own life but also those of all her brothers and sisters in the human family.

The invitation to Mary and all of us is to see things in a new way, to recognise God present among His people, Emmanuel (God-with-us). This is the paradox of the whole gospel: there is good news, news that calls for rejoicing and happiness, but it can be understood only when we grasp the fact that we are not in control. The angel calls us to stand in awe before the mystery of it all, acknowledging the fact that we do not have the answers. The revelation continues in the most unlikely ways and circumstances, reminding us that nothing is impossible to God. Like Mary, we are often at a loss to understand how or why, but we are able to join in her act of faith and accept that we are servants and handmaids of the Lord, echoing her testimony: 'Let what you have said be done to me.'
