We plan to explore the document by focusing on the main 'chapters'. We aim to cover :-

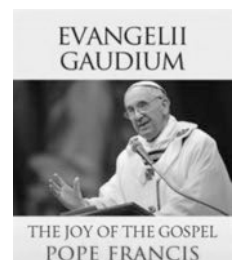
25 November – Communal Commitment

As little as a hundred years ago most of the countries in Europe had kings or other royal heads. Russia had the

Czar, Germany the Kaiser and Austria-Hungary the Emperor. They were absolute monarchs who ruled their kingdoms, if not with an iron fist, with

very few constitutional restraints. Then the First World War happened. In fact, that horrendous event was sparked off with the assassination of Archduke Ferdinand. He was gunned down by a Bosnian Serb in Sarajevo in 1913. By the time the war ended in 1918 most of the crown heads of Europe had been toppled. What remained was a handful of constitutional figureheads as in England, Holland and Belgium.

Today is the last Sunday of the liturgical year and we go out on a high. It is the feast of Christ the King. Most people imagine that this feast dates from the early Church or at least the days of the Holy Roman Empire. In fact, it was instituted only in the 1920s. The Church decided to give Christ a crown, precisely when most other kings were losing theirs. Of course he was a king. The gospels leave no doubt about that.

Remembering

In November we take special care to remember those we have loved and cared for but who have died. We recall them and celebrate their lives and the way they loved us, cared for us and taught us.



By recalling their memory we build a personal shrine – not as a table in a corner – but a place in our hearts for those we love.

Use the slip which is part of the leaflet available at the front of the church to record the names of your family, friends and acquaintances you wish to be remembered in prayer throughout the month of November.

Place the slip in the basket provided on the sanctuary, where it will remain throughout the month.

The first collection after Christmas will take place on **9 January**.
