### THE STORY OF PALM SUNDAY

Jesus Christ was not the first person to die for a cause, nor the last. He was not the first or the last innocent person to be put to death. He was not the only one ever crucified. There were on that very same day two others. Even as regards physical pain it is at least possible that others have suffered as much. What then makes the Passion so different? And it is undeniably different.

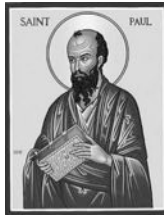
The gospel account is roughly about two newspaper columns long, and even though I have read it, or heard it read. What has this story to do with us? It is the story of our salvation. But it is more, much more. It is the story of our lives. There is not a part in the whole sordid script that we, you and I, would



not play to perfection. Peter in his pride and Peter in his fall and, hopefully, Peter in his repentance too. We would fit in perfectly with the disciples who fled at the first sign of danger, or with Caiaphas and the high priests, with their self-righteousness and eagerness to reform others while ignoring themselves, or with Pilate in his abuse of authority, or with the mob with its thirst for excitement and blood. And Judas? Let's face it – there's a Judas in all of us. There are times and situations in all our lives when Jesus could easily say to us as He said to Judas, 'Friend, why are you here?' The truth is, it was only His friends who could really have crucified Him so.

## A Reflection by Fr. Denis

That story of the Passion is not just description, it is an invitation too. The Passion of Christ is not over at all. It is meant to be reproduced every day in our lives. St Paul understood that very well when he said to the Philippians: 'That I may come to know Him and the power of His resurrection, and partake of His sufferings by being moulded to the pattern of His death' (3:10-12). St Paul was not inventing that for himself. What he was doing was echoing Christ: 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow Me. Anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for My sake will find it' (Mt 16:25).



So the important question for you and for me today is this: How do we enter more fully into the Passion of Jesus Christ? How do we reproduce in our lives the pattern of his death? Some years ago I attended a youngish woman who was dying of cancer. I don't think I have ever seen anybody suffer so much. She died inch by inch over three years. Every day was a prolonged encounter with pain. It was frightening. But every day, too, when the pain was at its worst, she asked for her prayer book. Only after she was dead did her family discover, and did I discover, the prayer she was actually saying. It was a prayer of St Francis, a sacrificial prayer, a mystical prayer. It said that God had looked at her cross, that He saw it was not an inch too long or an ounce too heavy, that He had weighed it very carefully before giving it to her. I was staggered. The level of spirituality at which the woman was dying and living! She certainly had the upward movement. She was offering her life with Christ to the Father. 'Not My will, but Thine be done.'
