Deacon Philip writes ...

WHAT IS ADVENT?

The word 'Advent' comes from the Latin *Adventus*, meaning 'coming'. Advent marks the beginning of a new liturgical year, when we look forward to the most important coming of all time – the Birth of Our Lord.

Advent is a season of preparation. It has significance because it is pointing towards something greater: first, the annual celebration of Christ's birth, *and* for the time when Christ will come again.

We often find it difficult with all the family arrangements for Christmas to truly focus on the spiritual side of our preparation. To help each of us to get ready, we can rely on the symbols of Advent to guide and encourage us.

The Advent Wreath is one visible sign of the month. The lighting of a new candle every week can be the focus for talking about the coming of Jesus and saying a short prayer. It is easy to make a wreath that



includes a fifth candle to be lit on Christmas day.

Many of us will have an Advent calendar at home. These provide a way of spending even a few moments each day in reflecting on the importance of what we call the 'Incarnation'; the coming of Jesus as a human in order to give us back all that God intended we should have.

We also have a need to be more deeply prepared, by being reconciled to God's love through the Sacrament of Penance (on Monday 15 December) and by setting aside a short, regular time to prayer for a better understanding of Jesus' coming in our lives.

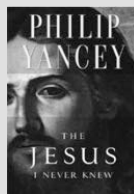
