5.	<ul> <li>Continuing Refugee Crisis – Jim Aylward</li> <li>The nightmare situation in the Middle East, particularly in Syria, continues. Two years ago, in September 2015, Pope Francis appealed for each Parish in Europe to take in one refugee family, and more recently, in February 2017, Cardinal Nichols asked for more parishes to sponsor a refugee family.</li> <li>I am aware that the whole issue has been thoroughly explored, and Anne Gadsden has produced an excellent outline of the story so far. It is apparent that for various reasons we are unable to take a family directly into our parish. Furthermore, there is evidently no prospect of involvement with the Kings Arms Project in Bedford.</li> <li>The UK Government have agreed to take 20,000 Syrian refugees from the camps in the Middle East over a 5-year period.</li> <li>I believe that there is a realistic course of action for us as a Parish to become involved and make a real difference. There is now a well-established group in Milton Keynes, known as Refugees Welcome Milton</li> </ul>

	Keynes (RWMK). This is collaboration between the MK Council (involving all the political parties), the Red Cross, and the local community. RWMK has already acquired five houses and has taken in 30 Syrian refugees (5 families) and are arranging to take in more. There is further information on their excellent website (rwmk.org.uk). They welcome further support, and their aim at present is to fit out more houses. They have a scheme 'Just One House' whereby organisations such as Parish Communities undertake to raise £3,500 for this purpose (i.e. to provide furniture and essential mod cons).  Dobviously as a Parish we would need to agree how much we can commit to, and how we would raise the funds. I think that the easiest way would be to appeal to families and individuals to sign up to a regular monthly contribution, but we would need to discuss the best way of going about this.  I do believe that this is a wonderful opportunity to make an important contribution to what is surely the greatest crisis of our times.  JA referred to Anne Gadsden's paper to the PAC.  Milton Keynes has a very good set up and they have a mosque and they would like more support. Could we fit out a house for a family from the Middle East?
