Presentation of the Lord also known as Candlemas – 2 February

According to Jewish law, the firstborn male child belonged to God, and the parents had to 'buy him back' on the fortieth day after his birth by offering a sacrifice of 'a pair of turtle doves, or two young pigeons' in the temple, thus, the presentation of the child (Luke 2:24). On that same day, the mother would be ritually purified, thus, the purification.

Mary and Joseph kept this law, though since Mary remained a virgin after the birth of Christ she would not have had to go through ritual purification. In his Gospel, Luke recounts the story (Luke 2:22-39). By the last quarter of the fourth century, the Church at Rome had begun to celebrate the Nativity on 25 December, so the Feast of the Presentation was celebrated on 2 February, 40 days later. When Christ was presented in the temple, Simeon embraced the child and prayed the Cantic of Simeon: 'Now thou dost dismiss thy servant, O Lord, according to thy word in peace; because my eyes have seen thy salvation, which thou hast prepared before the face of all peoples: a light to the revelation of the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel' (Luke 2:29-32).



Why Candlemas?

Inspired by the words of the canticle (a light to the revelation of the Gentiles), by the 11th century, the custom had developed in the West of blessing candles on the Feast of the Presentation. The candles were then lit, and a procession took place through the darkened church while the Cantic of Simeon was sung. Because of this, the feast also became known as Candlemas. Candlemas is still an important feast in many European countries.

Pope Francis suggests that for January we say grace before meals so we can begin to connect ourselves to God's creation.

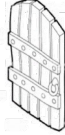


ANNUAL QUIET DAY

THE DOWRY TOUR OF MARY PILGRIMAGE TRIDUUM 7 TO 9 FEBRUARY

During the course of 2018 to 2020 the statue of Our Lady from the Slipper Chapel at the Catholic National Shrine in Walsingham will be taken to each cathedral in England for a three-day triduum of prayer, as part of the preparation for the re-dedication of England as the Dowry of Mary in 2020. Each visit will take place between a Thursday and Saturday.



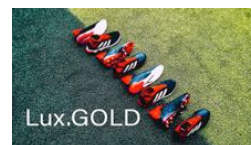
'A moment of great promise ... for the Church in this country and for our mission' Cardinal Vincent Nichols said.
