CATECHESIS FROM FR. JERRY

Theme: 'For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink...'

On the solemnity of the body and blood of Christ, the Church celebrates God's presence among humanity in his Son, Jesus Christ. This is God's greatest desire to share intimately in the ordinary lives of. In a depersonalised society where most people suffer from absence where there should be presence. People hunger and thirst for companionship, lack of love and concern, personal understanding and respect from society, the Eucharist is a gift of friendship. In the Gospel reading, Jesus Christ identified himself as the 'bread which came down from heaven'. At the Last Supper, he took the bread and the cup filled with wine and said, 'This is my body, this is my blood of the covenant'. Each time the priest repeats these words of consecration in the Mass, the substance of the bread and wine is changed into the body and blood of Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit (CCC#1375). Jesus affirms that the one who partakes in his body and blood will have eternal life. It is important to note that the words 'flesh', 'body' and 'blood' stand for the whole person. The Church teaches that in the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ and therefore, the whole Christ, is truly, really and substantially contained (CCC#1374).

Jesus invites us to share in an intimate relationship and friendship with him through the sacrament of his body and blood. At the human level, intimate relationships and friendships are very important for our emotional and mental well-being. Without a chain of close relationships with relatives, friends and well-wishers, our life will be stale and filled with stress. As St Thomas Aquinas wrote, 'It is the law of friendship that friends should live together. As friends, Christ has not left us without his bodily presence in this our pilgrimage of life, but he joins us to himself in this sacrament in the reality of his body and blood' (Summa Theologiae, III q. 75, a. 1).

In the Eucharist, the Church both receives the gift of Jesus Christ and gives grateful thanks to God for such a blessing. This thanksgiving is the only proper response, for through this gift of himself in the celebration of the Eucharist under the appearances of bread and wine, Christ gives us the gift of eternal life. Jesus Christ, therefore, insists that continuous encounter with him through the sacrament of his body and blood will strengthen us to experience real life, that is, everlasting life. Let us avail ourselves to share in this so great feast with Jesus Christ in his body and blood, soul and divinity at the Eucharist, so that we may have life in its fullness.
