PARISH CATECHESIS FROM FR. JERRY

Theme: There in their presence, Christ was transfigured.

The solemnity of the transfiguration of the Lord is one of the solemn moments where the voice of the Father designates Jesus as his 'beloved Son'. Before this solemn moment, Jesus had predicted his own suffering, death and resurrection. So, by this time he was on the way to the Cross. But before the final journey to the Cross, he had to make certain that it was indeed God's will that he should go to the Cross. Jesus went up Mount Hermon to ask God; he went up to the mountain to listen for the voice of God.

The transfiguration of Jesus took place on a high mountain before Peter, James and John – three witnesses chosen by himself. On this high mountain, Jesus' face and clothes become dazzling with light, and Moses and Elijah appeared, speaking of his departure, which he was to accomplish at Jerusalem. In Jewish literature, these two figures, Moses and Elijah always stood for certain things. Moses was the greatest of all the lawgivers. He was supremely and uniquely the man who brought God's law to men. Elijah was the greatest of all the prophets. In him, the voice of God spoke to men with unique directness. A cloud covers him and a voice from heaven says: 'this is my Son, my Chosen, listen to him' (CCC#554). Jesus calls himself the 'only Son of God' and this title affirms his eternal pre-existence (CCC#4444).

The transfiguration of the Lord reflects Christ's divinity in an extraordinary way. Just as at his baptism, the voice of his Father was heard calling Christ his 'beloved Son'. We have Moses and Elijah both encountering God on a holy mountain, Mountain Sinai and Mountain Horeb respectively, and representing the law and the prophets, Christ at the centre of the three indicates he is the centre of all revelation.

The transfiguration of the Lord is a spiritual journey of Jesus on the mountain. This spiritual encounter prepares him for the way to cross and death in Calvary. It was the experience on the Mount of Transfiguration that enabled Jesus confidently to walk the way to the cross.

Tuesday, 15 August is the Feast of the Assumption and a holy day obligation.


Mass will be held at 9.30 am followed by the rosary.



Feast of St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross - 9 August

She was born into a practising Jewish family. She had a distinguished career as a philosopher and received a doctorate at the University of Freiburg, but her academic career was impeded because she was a woman.

Reading the autobiography of Saint Teresa of Ávila brought about her conversion to Catholicism and she was baptised on 1 January 1922. She taught at a Dominican girls' school and studied Catholic philosophy. She became a lecturer at the Institute for Pedagogy at Münster but was thrown out of her post in 1933 as a result of the Nazi régime's anti-Semitic legislation.



She entered a Carmelite monastery in Cologne and took the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. Her order moved her to The Netherlands to keep her safe from the growing Nazi threat. While a Carmelite she wrote an important philosophical book, seeking to combine the phenomenology of her former teacher Edmund Husserl with the philosophy of Aquinas she also wrote on St John of the Cross.

On 20 July 1942 the Dutch Bishops' Conference had a statement read in all churches condemning Nazi racism. In retaliation the authorities ordered the arrest of all Jewish converts to Christianity. Teresa Benedicta was taken to Auschwitz and killed on 9 August 1942.
