PARISH CATECHESIS FROM FR JERRY

Theme: The mission of John the Baptist and the message of repentance

The Gospel of Mark introduces an important personality on the Second Sunday of Advent. He is John the Baptist, with a mission inspired by the love of God in the wilderness proclaiming repentance for the forgiveness of sins. A third-century theologian observed a pattern that contains a great mystery: whenever the Lord Jesus came, he was preceded in that coming by John the Baptist. Thus, even in the womb, John leapt to announce the presence of the Lord. The church's catechism describes him as the Elijah who must come. The fire of the Spirit dwells in

The fire of the Spirit dwells in him and makes him the forerunner of the coming Lord. In John, the precursor, the Holy Spirit completes the work of '(making) ready a people prepared for the Lord' (CCC#718). John the Baptist is 'more than a prophet. In him, the Holy Spirit concludes his speaking through the prophets. John completes the cycle of prophets begun by Elijah.' He proclaims the imminence of the consolation of Israel; he is the 'voice' of the Consoler who is coming. As the Spirit of truth will also do, John came to bear witness to the light. In John's sight, the Spirit thus brings to completion the careful search of the prophets and fulfils the longing of the angels. He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is he who baptises with the Holy Spirit. And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God... Behold, the Lamb of God'(CCC#719). Finally, with John the Baptist, the Holy Spirit begins the restoration to man of 'the divine likeness', prefiguring what he would achieve with and in Christ. John's baptism was for repentance; baptism in water and the Spirit will be a new birth.

Our preparation for the coming of the Messiah on Christmas Day must be one like John the Baptist. We must show repentance in our speech, in our actions, in our thoughts, and our personalities. 'God has promised forgiveness to your repentance, but he has not promised tomorrow to your procrastination.'
