PARISH CATECHESIS FROM FR JERRY

Theme: John the Baptist, a voice that cries in the wilderness

The third Sunday of advent continues with the story of John the Baptist. John's Gospel perceives John the Baptist as the forerunner of Jesus Christ. He joyfully comes to proclaim the fulfilment of God's plan in history and prepare us for the coming of Christ at Christmas.

He does not draw attention to himself in any way either as a priest or a Levite. He makes three specific denials. He says he is not the Messiah; neither is he Elijah nor the prophet. He denied being the Messiah because the Messiah was among them, but they did not know him. He denied being Elijah because he had not come to settle all disputes. Secondly, he has not come to anoint the Messiah to his kingly office. He was not the prophet. This is because he does not see himself as the greatest of all the prophets, Prophet par excellence.

If John the Baptist is none of those popular figures then who is he? What is he doing? The first question is answered from Isaiah 40:3; He is nothing but a VOICE inviting humanity to prepare the way for the King. John the Baptist sees Jesus as his superior, he says, 'I am not fit to kneel and undo the strap of his sandals'. His final act of utter humility is when he proclaims; 'He must increase, I must decrease' (John 3:30).

Christians are supposed to be joyful persons. Pope Benedict's famous quote is 'Being a Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but an encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction'. Unfortunately, people outside the Church do not associate Christians with joyful spirits. Therefore, our search for God, the source of our Joy, demands every effort of intellect, a sound will, an upright heart and the witness of others who teach us to seek God (CCC#30).

Like John the Baptist, we are reminded to know who we are and our mission. We can always be assured of happiness when we remind ourselves that God loves us so much that he sent his only Son to us on Christmas day.
